Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 6:40 pm by Brad Brauer, President.

Introductions: Those in attendance introduced themselves and the streets where they reside.

Approval of April 2010 minutes:

A motion was made by Chris Wertheim to approve the April 2010 minutes as written. Patrice Wappel seconded the motion and the motion passed by affirmative vote. There were no May minutes to approve at this time.

Financial Report:

Committee Updates:

Willo Plan Update, Chris Wertheim – Chris presented the status and estimated cost of the Willo Plan update. A meeting will be held tentatively for June 27th to evaluate and suggest revisions to the current plan.

Block Watch, Jon Whitcomb – Jon reported on upcoming Block Watch meetings and preparation for the painting of numbers on alley entries to properties.

Willo Tour – Jill Bray and Tom Vigil reported on the confirmations of homes that will be on the tour 2011. We have 1 confirmed and would like 14. The brochures and ads along with other media are going to press and everything is on schedule. The Committee will meet again in September.

Community Action Officer:

Office Knecht reported on incidents in Willo. The last 30 days generated 178 calls; among those of significance were four thefts, four vehicular thefts, four residential thefts, two commercial break-ins and one criminal damage crime. The change in First Friday art walk has been expanded to include 1st Avenue and Moreland to 3rd Street and Moreland. Officer Knecht also warned of a recent increase in the theft of catalytic converters. The fair is coming soon and there will be increases in police protection as there is always an increase in crime activity.

Street Scape: Tom Doescher reported that the construction design for this project was sent back to the City for review.

Old Business: The Willo Website will have a new design. It will hopefully be more user friendly. If anyone has any suggestions, email Brad Brauer.

New Business: The next deadline for articles for the September issue of Inside Willo is August 13th.

The Board will not meet in July or August.

Adjournment: There being no further business to discuss a motion was made by Lauren Zell and seconded by Leanne Stackpole to adjourn. The meeting was adjourned at 7:40 pm.
