What's Happening on Thomas at 5th Avenue?

Updates to the project on 535 W. Thomas Road

n March of this year, a project renewal request with minor interior changes was made to the CIty of Phoenix for the Metropolitan Lofts at 535 W. Thomas Road. You may remember that the building was originally a nursing home and was next intended to be an assisted living facility.

We are now told that 54 micro apartment living units with 3000 square feet of retail on the ground floor and amenities including a swimming pool are the plan.

This is a five-story building that appears to have driveways on either side of the building onto Thomas Road and alley access. It appears to have 60 to 70 parking spaces in the rear and 6 in the front.

We are also told that they should be ready to rent/lease in January. As of this writing, there is not yet signage stating this.

Members of your Willo board are currently researching zoning issues and are in contact with the Mayor and City Council Offices to ensure that the impact on our neighborhood is minimal.

ost Willo residents have a favorite front vard in their neighborhood, that one spot they enjoy driving by on the way to work each day because it looks great and they're not responsible for maintaining it. For me, that house is at 333 W. Palm Lane. Dan and Jane Kuni have lived here since 2003, and their front yard has everything I love in landscaping: clean lines, grass so green that it looks fake, comfortable seating and perfectlymaintained plants that thrive in both hot summers and cold winters.

The Kunis have lived all over the United States and frequently performed the yard

work and maintenance themselves, but in Willo they've brought in a little help to make it perfect. A landscape designer resigned their yard five years ago, and they have a great lawn maintenance team that helps out a couple of times a month. But the details are still up to the homeowners, who add seasonal flowers and extra touches to ensure they still get to spend some relaxing time in their front yard. The changes recommended by the landscape designer provided a new walkway and retaining walls that add the structural designs to make their yard unique. But it was Mother Nature that made the real chances necessary: their landscape changes began at the same time a storm brought down trees across the neighborhood. The beautiful carob tree that had anchored the Kunis' front yard was knocked

over, and a whole new look was required. While they didn't try to replace that tree, they have recently planted palm trees that mirror both their street name and the historical trees that line many of Willo's sidewalks

Their daughters Annie and Ellen are grown and pursuing college degrees, but the Kunis remain anchored to their Willo home. After fixing up older homes in numerous states, they're proud of the changes they've made and the life they've built in Phoenix. And everyone who takes time to appreciate their lovely front yard is grateful they're here to stay!


like the lack of garages—I feel that we get to connect with our neighbors more often than not. And I love being centrally located to the museums, library, the airport and the access to the major freeways.

Join the New Downtown Bicycle Action Group on Their First Ride The goal of the DBAG is to promote a First Ride Safe and fun bike culture in Phoenix

inding parking in Downtown Phoenix can be expensive and time consuming. The area around City Hall is full of parking meters that charge \$1.50 per hour requiring change and the parking garages charging far more. To relieve this pressure the city has encouraged alternate transportation with light rail stops near Chase Stadium, ASU downtown and City Hall. There are also programs to help pay for employee bus passes and promote carpooling. Mass transit and carpooling are effective at reducing the need for parking and the level of pollution created somewhat. However, this does little to encourage humans to improve their health. One local group, Downtown Bicycle Action Group, has formed around the idea of

solutions that would reduce pollution even more, promote exercise and take far less space than a vehicle by suggesting the city promote biking around downtown.

Currently the City of Phoenix Bike Subcommittee has a budget of roughly \$50,000 a year mainly for use to create and maintain bike lanes. The budget is far below many smaller cities. With

having expanded education, arts and sport opportuni-

ties downtown many feel it should invest in bikes next. The rapid growth Phoenix has seen in recent decades suggests a need for cheap transport and compact parking. To make this happen the city might need to expand the number of bike racks, and increase security for bikes near locks and bike storage. One suggestion that has been proposed is to establish a bike rental program like what has been established in cities such as Boston and Denver. The idea is that one would use a credit card to rent a bike at designated places throughout downtown Phoenix.

Bike repairs are often inexpensive, no pollution is created and bike riding encourages exercise. As the population keeps growing, obesity rates have increased and medical expenses are on the rise the city must find ways to promote a healthy and sustainable lifestyle for it's citizens.

Pushing for increased bike funding in Phoenix several locals formed the Downtown Bicycle Action Group.

They had their first meeting Sunday, December 2nd to try to figure out the best ways to address expanding the cities current programs.

"The purpose behind our group is to raise awareness of our presence on the road and within the community. Many potential riders in Phoenix choose not to ride for fear of accidents with motorists. So instead of adding more cars to the road, we want to bring more awareness to the community that cyclists are here. D.B.A.G. hopes to do this in many ways. Ultimately we'd like to see more and better maintained bike lanes, and bike racks. More group rides and bike festivals throughout the community. As well as increased education. Our meetings are for bringing these ideas together, and for taking action." Said Willo neighbor and DBAG member, John Kinser (Granada).

The Downtown Bicycle Action Group has discussed becoming a formal group for change with a mission statement, legal name and a board of directors. They plan to continue meeting the first Sunday of each month at different downtown locations and build teamwork thru group rides. One of the ways D.B.A.G would like to promote their mission is by participating in local bicycle events like the upcoming San Tan Wheelie Jam next March.

D.B.A.G. will host its first group ride on Sunday, Jan. 6 at 4:30 p.m., and is inviting members of the community to attend. The group will meet under the bridge at Margaret T. Hance Park at 4:30 p.m. and will depart at 5 p.m. The ride will end at The Duce for D.B.A.G.'s second official meeting at 6 p.m.

tis remarkable that the Willo neighborhood will be celebrating a quarter-century of historic home tours on

Sunday, February 10, 2013. In a city where land use and values have taken precedence over historic treasures, our neighborhood has seen a number of homes reach the century mark. It is for this reason that many of our home tour visitors return year after year to see our latest offerings.

Our home tour grows bigger every year due to the hard work of our Home Tour Committees. This year the event is co-chaired by Lisa Bliss (Coronado) and Andrea Meury (Monte Vista). We started with a few hundred visitors 25 years ago and have grown to more than 3,000 visitors last year.

Some highlights: On our sixth tour, 650 attended. On our seventh, we sold 1400 tickets at \$5.00 each. Our eighth tour was almost cancelled because only three homes were committed to the tour. It went from worst to best though due to the dogged determination of then Chair Dy-Ann Markey. She asked that one person from each home attend in order to

guarantee that the 1996 tour would be the biggest in history... and it was! 1,200 visitors! This was also the year that Sue Doerfler from the Arizona Republic voted the



Willo Home Tour the "Best of Phoenix" home tour. Talk about rags-to-riches! Our 10th annual in 1998 had 13 homes with a \$10.00 admission. A dollar discount was given for a canned food donation. 900 people attended in spite of the rain. Rain overtook us again three years ago but the committee has things down

to a science. Special matting was secured and homes remained in pristine condition at the end of the day .By the 11th tour 2100 people attended. The 12th tour saw

2650 in attendance and at this pont we had over 40 vendors. By 2001, Tracy Gromer had chaired three years-in-a-row. We sold 2000 tickets that year. A home tour visitor took an unexpected dip in a pool! We have since added a beautiful classic car show to the mix.

In addition to the Home Tour Committee, which is our largest, we have numerous other committees that also work very hard to continue to cause Willo to be a premier destination. Since we are so well established, these committees bring us together with our neighbors with a wonderful result of tight friendships and cooperation that used to be a given in days past. Our many visitors sense

when they enter Willo that they are someplace special and that there is much more to discover in addition to our beautiful historic treasures.




