# Willo GO PHX Bond Committee Update

ON SEPTEMBER 9, 2022 WILLO GO PHX BOND COMMITTEE member Eric Gilmore (Coronado), spoke before the Phoenix GO Bond Streets and Storm Drainage Subcommittee to request funding for mitigation of the drainage problems in the northeast area of Willo. Streets flooding in Willo is not currently on their "priorities list", it is noted as one of hundreds of local drainage mitigation projects the City plans to address in the future. Eric reminded the Streets and Transportation leadership and the Subcommittee members that Willo has been seeking mitigation of this drainage issue since at least 2017.

Opal Wagner (Coronado), Willo Streets and Traffic Safety Chairperson, also spoke at the Subcommittee meeting to request that "pedestrian scramble" crosswalks be established at the intersections of Central Ave. and McDowell and Central Ave. and Thomas to provide a safer

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



# **Exterior Rehab Grants are Back!**

### GREAT NEWS FOR WILLO

homeowners! The City of Phoenix has funded the Historic Preservation Exterior Rehab grant program for 2023, but you must act quickly — THE APPLICATION DEADLINE IS NOVEMBER 18, 2022.

This grant program is designed to assist homeowners with the preservation of their historic properties through sensitive rehabilitation of exterior features such as roofs, windows, lost or damaged architectural elements, foundation repair, etc. Successful applicants can receive between \$5,000 and \$20,000 in matching funds to complete their projects, which is significant!

The application process homeowners requires fully document the proposed project in writing and photos provide comprehensive estimates for repairs. It is also helpful to detail how this project fits into the long-term plans for the rehab of the home and how the proposed repairs contribute to the goals of the city's Preservation Philosophy. A committee consisting of HP staff and community members

# PROJECTS ELIGIBLE FOR GRANT FUNDING

All work performed must be exterior work, which results in the repair, improvement, reconstruction, maintenance, or enhancement of the facades or exterior faces of the subject property. Eligible exterior work may include:

- Roof repairs/
- replacement
  Foundation repairs
- Structural rehabilitation/ reinforcement
- Exterior wall repairs
- Masonry/stucco repairsExterior window and
- doors repairs

  Porch and step
- rehabilitation

  Cornice and parapet
- repairs
  Re-painting (if a part of an eligible repair)
- Historic garage, guest house, or carport rehabilitation
- Reversal of previous inappropriate alterations
- Demolition of non-historic additions
- Reconstruction of original architectural elements based on documentation/ evidence

evaluates the applications based on the importance of the restoration to the long-term survival of the building and the extent to which the proposed repair respects the original architectural elements of the home.

Last year, which was the first time in many years that the city offered this grant, 63 applications were reviewed, and only 12 grants were awarded before the money ran out. So keep in mind that the competition is fierce! Make sure applications are complete and provide enough history so the committee can understand the importance of the project. It will help to read through the informational materials on the city of Phoenix website before beginning an application — they can be found here: www.phoenix. gov/pdd/historic-preservation/ exterior-rehab-assistance.

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
