






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MARCH 2023 BOARD ELECTION

Thank You, Home Tour Volunteers!

AS OF THIS WRITING,

Willo Home Tour 2023 is still a week away, but all indications are it will be another epic success thanks to the dedication and hard work of Linda Doescher and Sandra Lefcovich, our amazing co-chairs, along with all the homeowners, committee chairs and volunteers. It truly takes a village of talented and generous neighbors to pull off this amazing event each year. Willo Home Tour will always have a special place in my heart: After searching and searching for a home in Central Phoenix during the rebounding real estate market of a decade ago, my husband John and I serendipitously found our forever home during Willo Home Tour 2013! If you haven't yet taken the opportunity to become involved in Willo Home Tour - Willo's only fundraising event - please consider signing up in 2024. I promise you will never have a more rewarding or enjoyable volunteer experience with nicer people.

Transformation of 3rd and 5th Avenues through Willo to Begin this Month!

Vision 3.5 is the name Bob Cannon, then Willo's newly elected President in 2017, christened the Willo Board's ambitious plan to reclaim and restore 3rd and 5th Avenues' original designation and purpose - as local neighborhood streets. Commuter cut-through traffic and speeding were making 3rd and 5th Aves. feel increasingly unsafe, and the Willo Conservation Plan was

not being followed. Per the City of Phoenix Street Classification System, Local/Residential streets "are typically in residential areas and provide connectivity between the collectors and arterials for local traffic." (Emphasis added). Traffic congestion on adjacent arterials and navigation apps such as Waze and Google maps were pushing traffic traveling to and from downtown onto 3rd and 5th Avenues, which were never intended for this purpose.

After six-plus years of advocacy, lobbying, and pleading our case for funding through the last few City of Phoenix budget cycles, construction of road safety improvements to 3rd and 5th Avenues is finally set to begin this month. I am grateful to have



played a small role in advancing this project by succeeding Nikki Armstrong, Lara Sands, and Lisa Helm as chairperson of the Willo 3.5 Streets and Traffic Safety Committee under Bob Cannon's leadership these past few years. We owe them all a debt of gratitude, along with the many Willo neighbors who showed up at the 3rd and 5th Ave. Public Meetings and the City's annual Budget meetings to plead our case and provide thoughtful recommendations over the past few years. Because of you all, Vision 3.5 is now becoming a reality. A huge thanks, as well, is owed to our Councilwoman Laura Pastor and the Streets Transportation Department, led by Kini Knudson. I used to have

a poster on the wall of my middle school classroom that said, "Dream it, Plan it, Do it." Well, neighbors, we did it!

Patience and flexibility from Willo neighbors will be key to bringing this project to successful completion as construction gets underway on 5th Avenue this month, followed by improvements to 3rd Avenue (McDowell to Edgemont) in the coming months and concluding with major improvements to the intersection of 3rd Avenue and Thomas sometime in 2024 or early 2025. The entire process is expected to be completed within the next 18-24 months. We have confirmed with the City that fourway stops will be added at Encanto Blvd. at 3rd and 5th Avenues.


It has been a pleasure and an honor to have served on the Willo Board and various neighborhood committees over the past few years. The talent pool in Willo is deep and wide,



My Florist — A Lasting Legacy

IF YOU ARE NEW TO WILLO,

you may wonder why the ornate sign above The Habit on McDowell and 7th Ave. says "My Florist" when no flower shop exists in this small strip center. My Florist flower shop opened in 1947 and was the centerpiece of the retail center until 1996, when it finally closed. The flower shop was owned by Vada Pearl Schwartz, a lively and eccentric woman who ran it until her death in 1966. She loved the color purple — so much so that she had a custom-built purple Cadillac. Vada was succeeded by her daughter, Norma Brooking, who kept the shop going until her death when the employees took over the business.

Vada commissioned the 3-story purple (of course!) sign from famous Phoenix neon sign designer Glenn Guyette. Guyette is well known around the Valley for signs such as the one atop the Valley National Bank headquarters, the Mr. Lucky's sign on Grand Ave (still standing), and the "Let's Eat!" sign on Bill Johnson's Big Apple on Van Buren Street.

Just to the west of the 1947-era building housing, My Florist is the older Hurley Building, constructed in two parts beginning in 1929 and added to the National Historic Register in 1985. The brick Art Deco building was the first retail center in Phoenix, which resulted from

a new zoning ordinance calling for neighborhood commercial districts at major intersections of what otherwise was a residential area (and at the time, Willo was in the 'burbs). The Hurley Building was the first commercial center of My Florist building into My Florist Café and eventually opened an organic grocery as well. The aptly named café was very popular with locals and the neighborhood for over a decade until Lacy defaulted on the mortgage and lost the



its kind to offer retail businesses within walking distance of neighborhood homes.

The preservation of the Hurley building and the My Florist sign, a fine example of a vanishing American art form, is a great example of how neighborhood activism can significantly affect historic preservation! In 1996, both the Hurley and My Florist properties were purchased by a California investment-banker-turned baker named David Lacy, who first opened the Willo Bakery, and then turned the glass-fronted

building. After sitting empty for several years, My Florist and The Hurley Building were redeveloped to include the restaurants there today. The locally famous sign was not included in the original redevelopment plan, but residents fought hard to keep it in place.
