## **Hello Neighbors!**

I'M READY TO GET BACK into the swing of things with a normal schedule. I hope you all had a great time, enjoyed summer (elsewhere), and caught the tail end of a less-than-eventful mon-

We're obviously in full swing for construction on 3rd and 5th Avenues. There are two different companies doing the work, and once in a while, some miscommunication occurs. If you have a question about what you're seeing or what the crews are telling you, contact me, and I'll see what I can do to assist you.

The city has a construction hotline residents can use as well for any questions or concerns that you have: 623-825-3444. This construction is quite a process, and your patience is appreciated.

The city council is attempting to address a housing shortage in Phoenix. One idea is to allow property owners to build an ADU (Accessory Dwelling Unit) in their backyard. Although many guest houses have been built in Willo since World War Two, the most recent city ordinances would not allow them to be rented separately. To add housing, the city would change that ordinance to allow long-term rentals in

those properties. The city would not allow short-term rentals, often referred to by the commercial title of Airbnb. At this point, there isn't a definition of a long-term or short-term rental from the city or how they would regulate these new ordinances. However, these changes have been inconsistent before being finalized, so I would recommend following changes with the city of Phoenix and contacting Councilwoman Laura Pastor's office if you have or are considering adding a guest house/ADU.

I'm excited to announce Willo Home Tour Committee Chairs are in place and taking off with a bang: Courtney Sutherland of Palm Lane and Crawford Breedlove of Encanto Boulevard. Their photos grace the cover of this issue, and we are thankful to have them.

### The WPA in Willo

### OVER THE YEARS, YOU MAY

have seen the WPA stamps on some Willo sidewalks. Usually, the stamp includes a date —1936 is the earliest stamp I have seen, but some are as late as 1940 or so. It turns out many people don't know what the WPA was or its significance.

The Works Progress/Projects Administration\* (WPA) was a public program started in 1934 by President Franklin Delano Roosevelt (FDR) as part of his New Deal. The goal of the WPA was to put unemployed people (mostly men) to work during the Great Depression while improving infrastructure across the United States. The program ran from 1935 to 1943, ending when huge numbers of American men joined the armed forces in advance of WWII. Most of those employed by the WPA were manual laborers who were put to work building roads, bridges, schools, libraries, government buildings, and parks. However, there were also special projects that employed artists, writers, musicians, performers, craftspeople, and researchers.

The project was a success, although it was not without detractors. Some thought the WPA was just another form of government dole, while others thought it was intended to build a loyal army (TOP) WPA

of FDR-supporting voters. But over the course of the program, the WPA employed 8.5 million people

at a total cost of \$11 billion. The number of completed projects is staggering, including many in Arizona. In Phoenix, the WPA built miles of roads and sidewalks, and also many buildings, including the main post office on Central and Filmore, the clubhouse and old band shell at Encanto Park (who remembers the band shell?), and all the roads, trails and buildings in South Mountain Park. The WPA was also responsible for the art-moderne Civic Building at the Arizona State Fair Grounds and the Grand Stand, with 23 bas-relief sculptures by WPA artists on the exterior.

As you may have guessed, home construction in our historic districts stopped after 1929 and didn't really pick up again until 1935. The New Deal was instrumental

in jump-starting construction again through programs like the WPA and the Federal Housing Administration (FHA). My next article will talk about the influence the FHA had on homes in our neighborhood.

\*The original name for the WPA was the Works Progress Administration, but it was changed in 1938 to the Works Projects Administration. ■

intimidated by this interviewee. ### WILLO WAS ONCE THE

epitome of suburbia - a collection of subdivisions on the outskirts of the small but thriving Phoenix metropolis. This charming neighborhood sits between 1st and 7th Avenues, north of McDowell Road and south of Thomas Road. It features a variety of architectural styles, including Bungalow, Tudor Revival, Greek Revival, American Colonial, Pueblo Revival, and Ranches. Twentytwo separate subdivisions were platted and developed in Willo by various entrepreneurs from the turn of the century up to the beginning of World War II. The city's tremendous growth resulted in the encroachment of commercial development on what were once quiet suburbs. Eventually, with the growth of Phoenix over the last century, the individual subdivisions were bypassed, and the area blended into one cohesive whole. In the 1980s, residents of Willo successfully lobbied for status as a special conservation



district, earning historic status and assuring that this beautiful part of Phoenix's history will be preserved for the enjoyment of future generations.

Initially planned in the 1920s, Willo is one of Phoenix's first historic neighborhoods and is now part of the core of Central Phoenix with all the amenities, culture, and community the area has to offer. Visit us to wander through our palm-lined streets and glimpse Phoenix's past with historic architectural styles -Tudors, Bungalows, Spanish Colonials, and later Ranch styles. The Willo neighbors are a tightknit, supportive community that takes advantage of living in the urban core of Phoenix.

Now in its 35th year, the Willo Home Tour is an annual event organized by the Willo Neighborhood Association. It has a nationwide presence, with visitors traveling from several states to enjoy the historic charm and preservation efforts of the Willo Neighborhood in Downtown Phoenix, Arizona. ■





### When it Rains in Willo

#### IT HAS BEEN A VERY DRY

"nonsoon" season this year. Our backyard weather station has only recorded 0.75" of rain this summer. But as we all know, our Willo streets often flood when we do get rain (or when a water main breaks!). Some of this is due to poor or no stormwater management to the east of us, but much of it is because we are a historic neighborhood and our stormwater infrastructure is old, infirm, or inadequate.

Eric Gilmore (Coronado) has done an admirable job of documenting the severity and spatial distribution of our street flooding, as well as the history of our stormwater infrastructure. Willo resident Zak Holman (Monte Vista) and Enrique Vivoni, my ASU colleagues from our engineering school, have suggested that we reach out to the Maricopa County Flood Control District about these issues. They have a Small Project Assistance Program (SPAP) designed for these types of high-frequency, small flooding

events (see https://www.maricopa.gov/5440/District-Programs#spap). I believe the WNA Board is planning to pursue some of these options for us.

Newer developments in the Valley are required to have infrastructure in place to retain and manage their stormwater on-site, and many use less-engineered and more nature-based solutions for this (e.g., detention basins that double as small parks when they are dry). Unfortunately, these types of [what we call] "urban ecological infrastructure" solutions are likely not viable alternatives to our aging pipebased stormwater systems in Willo because we simply do not have the space. That said, there are things that we can do as individual homeowners to make it easier for our old stormwater drains and pipes to do their job. For example, years ago, when we decided to reduce our front yard turf area by about half, one of the things we did was dig out the swale (the area between the

sidewalk and the curb) so that its ground level was about 3-4" below the sidewalk and curb (first photo). This had the added advantage of getting rid of the root system of the grass, keeping it from resprouting. We then planted the swale with native and drought-tolerant vegetation and added crushed granite (second photo). This feature now captures runoff from our roof and front vard and holds it before it can make it to the street. This small stormwater detention basin is effectively a parcel-scale bioswale or rain garden. If more Willo homeowners did things like this, it would mean that our engineered stormwater infrastructure would need to only manage street runoff.

So consider turning your swale, if you have one, into a rain garden so that you can manage your stormwater runoff using urban ecological infrastructure. And please, be sure to keep the storm drains on your street free of debris.
